Our Persecuted Brothers and Sisters

Turkey is #31 on the 2018 Open Doors persecution watch list.

Religious nationalism has grown to new heights. President Erdogan has strengthened his position, trying to transform Turkey from a secular state into a Sunni Muslim one. Leaving Islam for Christianity is considered a betrayal of the Turkish identity, Islam and the family.

Christians have no access to state jobs and experience discrimination in private employment, especially where employers have ties to the government. Converts often experience heavy pressure from family, friends and their community to return to Islam.

Pray for Christians from a Muslim background to minister graciously and wisely to their families.

Pray for God to enable those experiencing persecution to place all hope and trust in Him.

Pray for those who are labeled and treated as traitors after embracing the Christian faith.

Sri Lanka - A pastor, his wife and two other Christians were assaulted recently after leaving a birthday party at the home of another Christian. Five villagers confronted the Christians, threatening and verbally abusing the pastor. When the Christians continued walking away, the attackers began throwing stones at them, injuring the pastor’s wife and another female. The pastor later filed a complaint at the local police station. Although Christians in Sri Lanka can worship openly, local Buddhists often stir up anti-Christian sentiment, leading to attacks like this one. Pray for healing of the two injured women, and pray that Christians will have the courage to keep meeting despite these threats.
